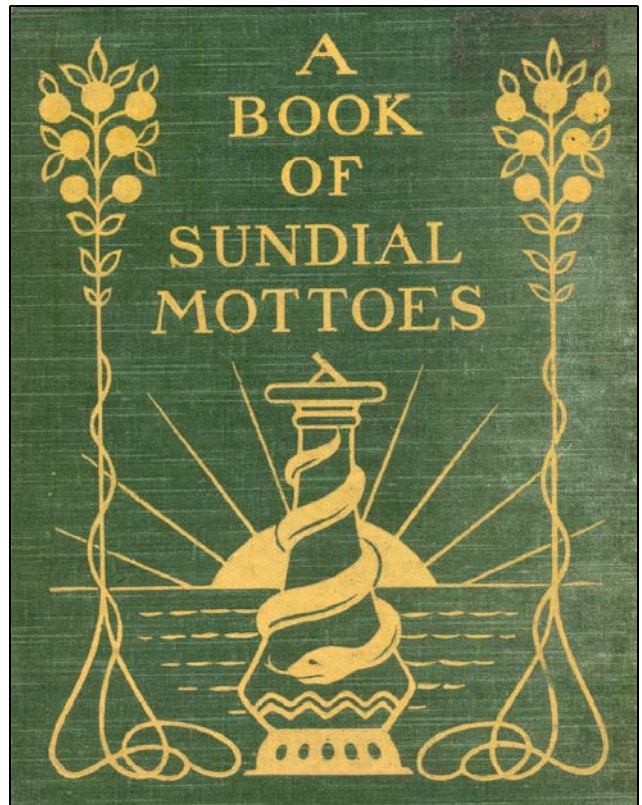
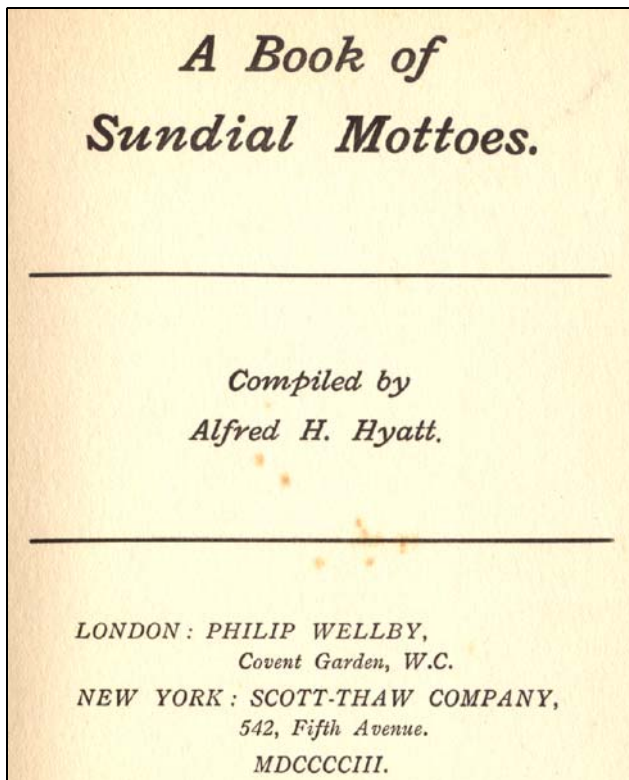


ALFRED H. HYATT, A BOOK OF SUNDIAL MOTTOES

"A *Book of Sundial Mottoes*" by A. M. is a small book Compiled by Alfred H. Hyatt, mainly of mottoes. It begins:

The following Sixty "Mottoes for Dials, with their meaning in English," are from a curious and rare old work, entitled "Mechanick Dialling : or, the New Art of Shadows : freed from the many Obscurities, Superfluities and Errors of *Former Writers* upon this Subject . . . To which are added a choice Collection of *Mottoes* in Latin and English . . . By Charles Leadbetter. London, at the Black Swan, 1737."

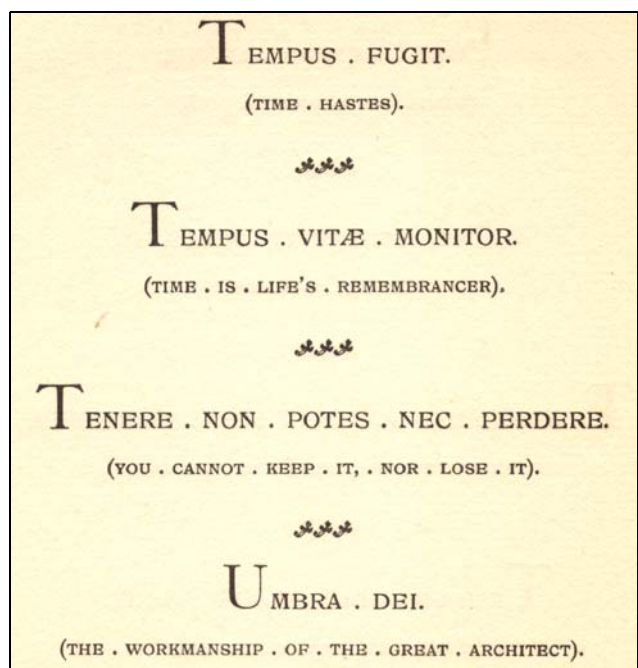
