




This gives a general introduction to Sundials and it describes some of the earliest dials to be found, starting with a 'Dial found at base of Cleopatra's Needle'.

The first part of this section mainly covers Mottoes. Then it goes on to explain how to make Dials.


TO MAKE THE DRAWING FOR A HORIZONTAL DIAL.
