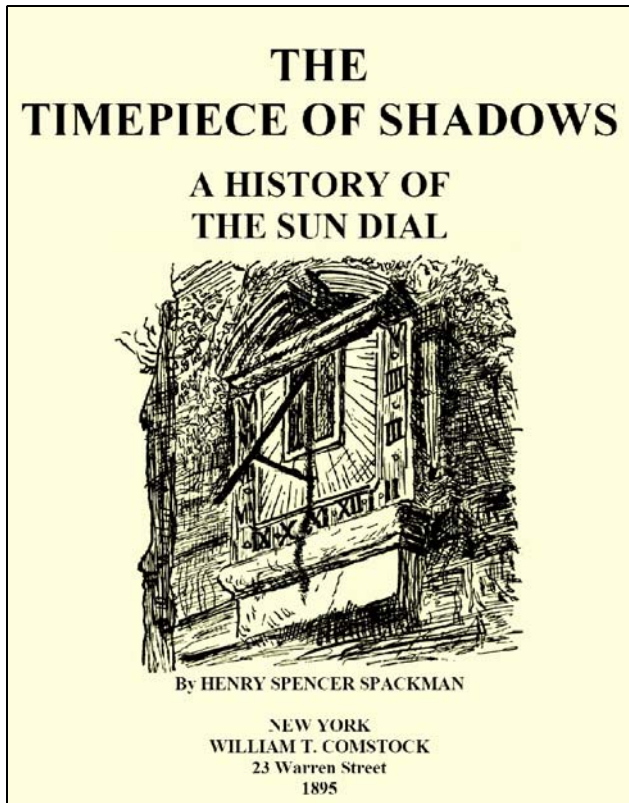

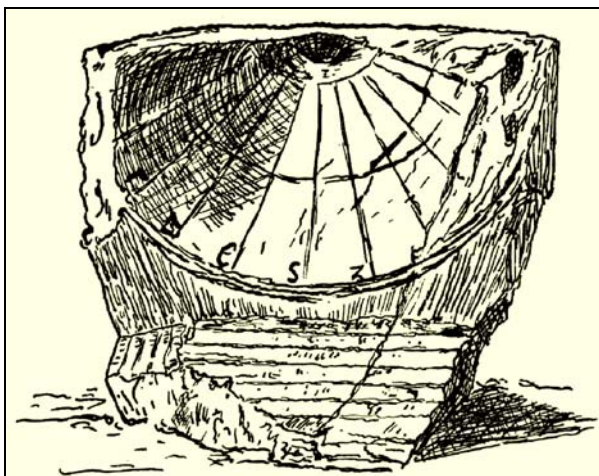

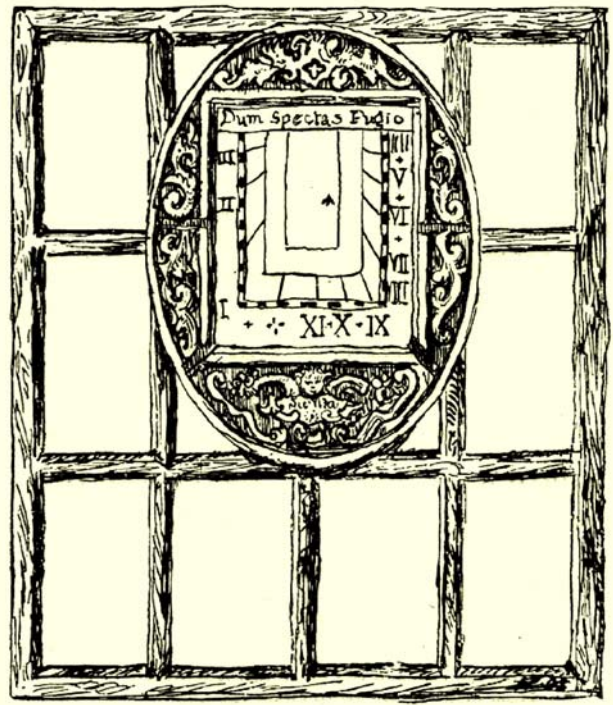
This gives a general introduction to Sundials and it describes some of the earliest dials to be found, starting with a ‘Dial found at base of Cleopatra’s Needle’.

The first part of this section mainly covers Mottoes. Then it goes on to explain how to make Dials.

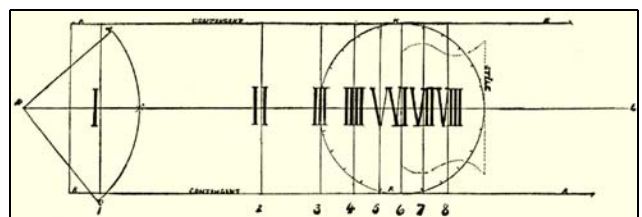
TO MAKE THE DRAWING FOR A HORIZONTAL DIAL.

A SOUTH VERTICAL OR DIRECT DIAL.

TO DRAW AN ERECT OR VERTICAL NORTH DIAL.

TO DRAW AN EAST OR WEST DIRECT VERTICAL DIAL.

AN ERECT SOUTH DIAL, DECLINING EITHER TO THE EAST OR WEST.
