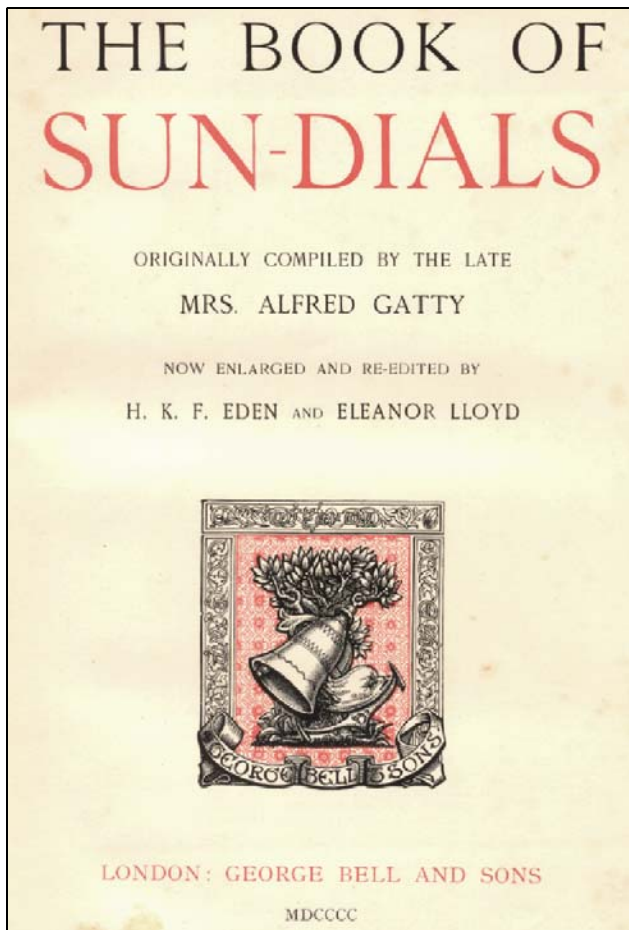


# MRS. ALFRED GATTY, THE BOOK OF SUN-DIALS

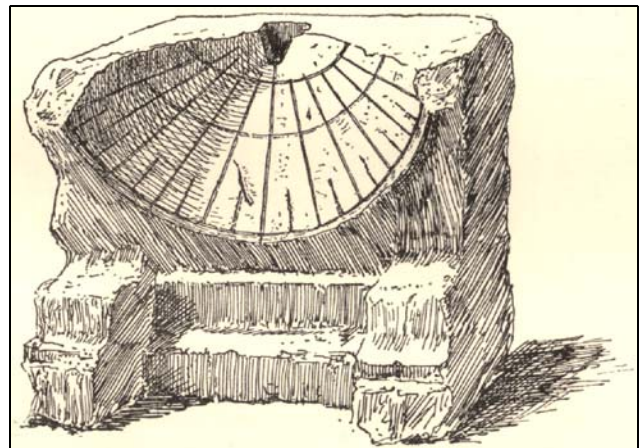

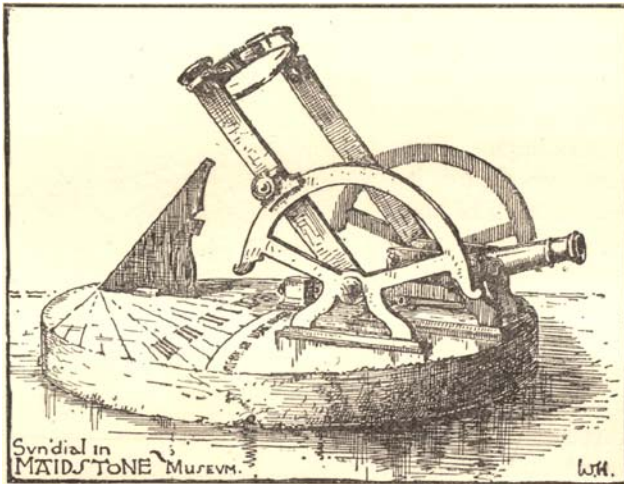
*Photograph of the Saxon Dial at Kirkdale, Yorks*

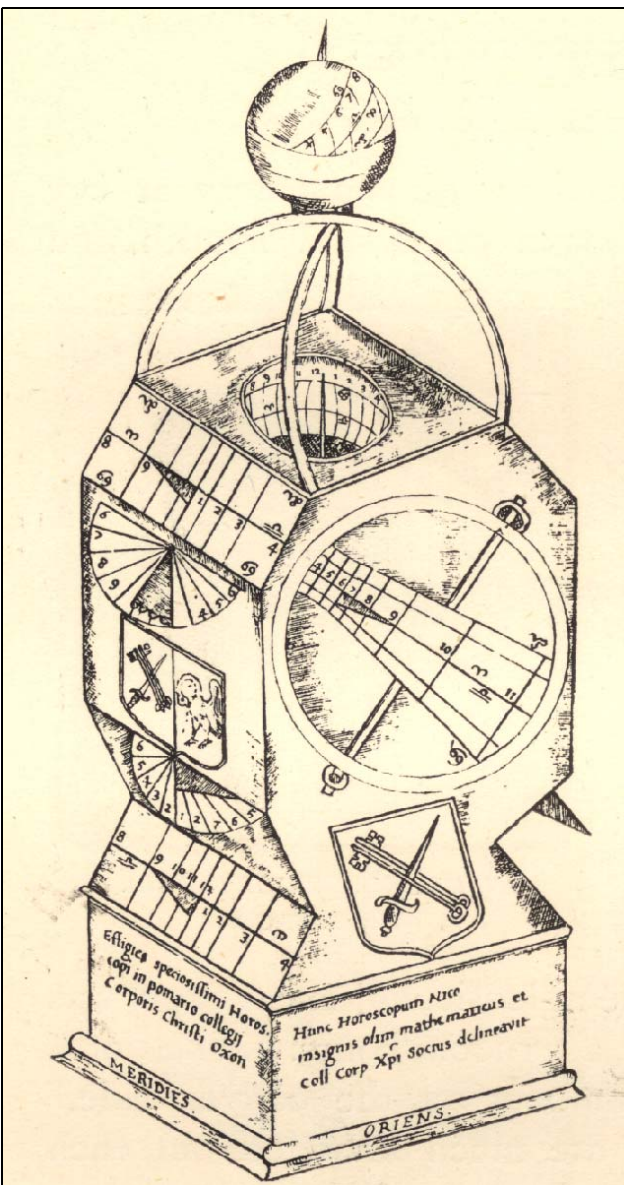

*Dial by Kratzer at Corpus Christi College, Oxford*

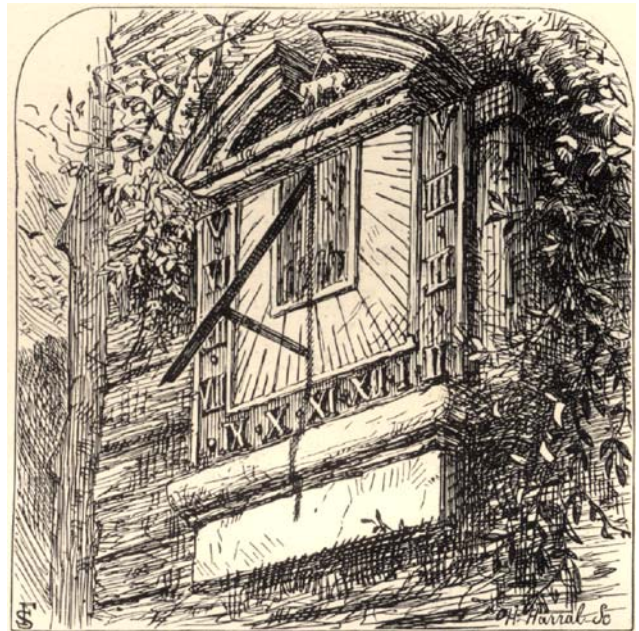
This is followed by four pages of Tables showing, for each day of the year, the Sun's *Apparent* Declination and Equation of Time, *to be added to Apparent Time*.

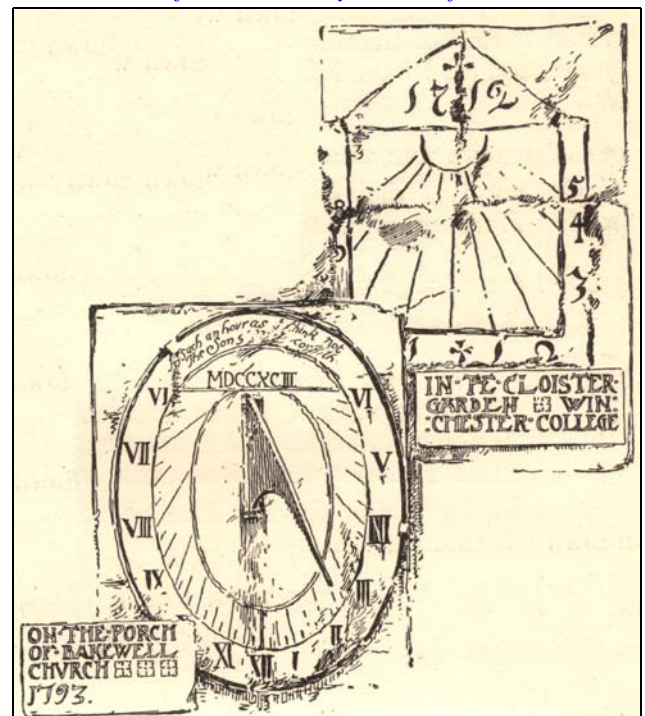
### EARLY ENGLISH DIALS
